Wheelock's Latin by Frederic M. Wheelock & Richard A. LaFleur

SYNOPSIS: Latin originated and developed in Italy, becoming the lingua franca of the vast Roman Empire. This textbook is considered the premier classical Latin textbook, implementing classical Latin authors—like Cicero and Virgil—into the student's learning process. First published in 1956, it has continued to be one of the top textbooks wholistically introducing students to classical Latin—one of the foundational Romance languages.

→ REASON FOR TEACHING: Jesus' early life and ministry took place in under Roman (Latin-speaking) rule. Knowledge of classical Latin provides students deeper insights into the historical context in which Christ lived. Latin also grants students access to many primary sources of Church history. As mentioned in the synopsis, this textbook is considered the premier classical Latin textbook. It effectively presents the language to students, logically building the learning journey from beginner to advance, and incorporating active learning through translating primary texts.

DISCLAIMER: This text includes examples of classical Roman art and culture to help students understand the context within which the language was employed. It mentions Roman mythology.
